Bayou Club Local Rules

- USGA Rules govern all play, except where modified by local rules.
- The embedded ball rule is in effect through the green.
- Worn areas immediately adjacent to the cart path are part of the obstruction. (Rule 24).
- Swing and stance relief may be taken from newly planted and staked trees; nearest point, no closer to the hole.
- Telephone poles on the left side of hole #2 are treated as an immovable obstruction. Player may take relief only if the pole interferes with swing or stance. (Rule 24). If a ball strikes the power lines or support wires, the player must replay the shot with no penalty. (Dec. 33-8/13).
- The fences on the left side of hole #4 and behind #7 green are boundary fences and are not obstructions. No relief. (Rule 24).



- The sand area between #9 and #18 is considered a waste area. You may ground your club.
- Hole #16 - if a player is not certain his/her ball has cleared the hazard fronting the green, the player may hit a "provisional" ball from the drop area behind the water hazard fronting the green. If the original ball is found outside the hazard, the player must abandon the provisional ball and continue play with the original ball. If the original ball is found within the margin of the hazard, the player must choose to either play the original ball as it lies or continue to play with the provisional ball. (Appendix I, Local Rules: 4). If a ball is hit into the hazard directly in front of the bridge tee, the player must proceed under Rule 26.
- Any ball crossing the margin of a public roadway and coming to rest in another part of the course is out of bounds. Any ball coming to rest within the margin of a public roadway is out of bounds.
- Any ball crossing the margin of the hazard right of holes #1, left of #6, right of #8, left of #9, or left of #10, is out of bounds. Any ball landing on private property is considered out of bounds.

Reminders:

- 100, 150, and 200 markers and sprinkler head yardages are measured to the center of the green.
- "Lollipops" located on both sides of the fairway indicate carts must stay on the cart paths at all times beyond that point.
- Please keep carts on cart paths on all par 3's and 30 feet from tees, bunkers, mounds and greens on all other holes.
- Please repair all ball marks on greens, fill divots with sand and rake bunkers.
